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Searching for Wine Treasures From France's Rhône Valley

The Rhône Valley begins in Vienne, 18 miles south of Lyon, and is divided in two: the northern Rhône, from Vienne to Valence, and the southern, from Montelimar to Avignon. The north includes among others Côte-Rôtie, Condrieu, Crozes-Hermitage, Hermitage and Cornas; the southern appellations include Côtes-du-Rhône Villages, Gigondas, Vacqueyras, Baumes-de-Venise, Tavel and Châteauneuf-du-Pape.

The Rhône's main red grapes are Syrah in the north and Grenache in the south, with many other supporting grapes. Little white wine is made in either place, but what is made in the north comes mostly from Viognier, Marsanne and Roussanne grapes. In the south, the main white grapes are Viognier and Muscat. Tavel, in the south, produces a Rosé.

Côtes-du-Rhône, more rustic and simple than the region's more expensive wines accounts for the majority of Rhône Valley reds. A blended wine, it can include up to 20 grape varieties; but typically, it is

made from Grenache with proportions of Syrah, Mourvèdre, Cinsault and Carignan. More than decent and certainly enjoyable, Côtes-du-Rhône wines are great bargains; while Côtes-du-Rhône Villages costs a little more.

Unlike the northern Rhône vineyards that cling to the riverbank, the vines of the Southern Rhône spread 20 or 30 miles east and west of the river, where Côtes-du-Rhône wines predominate.

The best northern Rhône wine is from Hermitage, a bold red made from the Syrah grape. Grown in gravelly soil, they are full bodied wines with aromas and flavors of red berries, chocolate and leather, and they become smooth and mellow with aging.

In the south, the most well known and esteemed wine is from the Châteauneuf-du-Pape region, meaning 'the pope's new castle,' so named when the Papacy was moved from Rome to Avignon in 1309 for nearly seventy years. Though Châteauneuf-du-Pape is softer and faster-maturing than any of the top northern

Rhône red wines, the best are powerful and dry, owing to the hard work the vines must do to survive on the mistral-battered hillsides and plateaus of the dry, rocky region where olives trees also grow.

Gigondas is considered the second best wine of the the Southern Rhône. It was given the appellation in the 1960's to distinguish it from the more accessible Côtes-du-Rhône. At its best, Gigondas is a full-bodied, concentrated red wine that approaches Châteauneuf-du-Pape in complexity.

Rhône winemakers like Guigal and Perrin who are committed to new grape-growing and wine-making techniques have managed to retain a certain rusticity while making increasingly more sophisticated wines. Like a diamond in the rough, Rhône wines can but should not be overlooked. Do yourself the favor of giving them a try. ♦

Sheila: Bearboat Chardonnay 2006 (Russian River Valley) **\$12.99** (reg \$14.99) With aromas of ripe apple, vanilla and toast, this Chard has supple body and a buttery texture. Serve with crab cakes over mixed greens.

Damian: Shotfire Shiraz 2008 (AUST) **\$18.99** (reg \$22.49) With lifted fruit aromas and a palate of chocolate and plum, the restrained oak aging leads to subtle vanilla flavors. A big, dark and delicious wine.

Denise: Château Fortia Châteauneuf du Pape 2004 (Rhone Valley) **\$25.99** (reg \$29.99) Rich barnyard aromas with elegant notes of licorice and black raspberry on the palate. Nicely structured, well balanced.

Ian: Domanie La Bouïssiere Gigondas 2007 (Rhone Valley) **\$25.99** (reg \$30.99) A sophisticated oak character with delicate aromas of pepper and red fruits. Serve with red meats, wild game or bold cheeses.

Graham: Chateau-Fortia Chateauneuf-Du-Pape 2004 (Rhone Valley) **\$25.99** (reg \$27.99) Medium bodied with good fruit concentration of currants and cherries. Characteristic Garigue spicy notes; finishes with fine tannins.

James: Layer Cake Malbec 2008 (ARG) **\$13.99** (reg \$15.99) 91 Pts. (RP) Notes of blackberry, earth and a hint of spice, this wine exhibits great fruit, delicious, full-bodied texture, silky tannins and a long finish.

Michele: Excelsior Cabernet Sauvignon 2007 (SA) **\$6.79** (reg \$7.99) Ripe black currants and plummy fruit on the nose lead to soft ripe tannins that balance toasty oak aromas and sweet fruit flavors.

Chocolate Hazelnut Mousse Cake

(Courtesy of Bellini's Italian Eatery)

Cake: 1 3/4 c sugar	2 eggs
1 3/4 c flour	1 c milk
3/4 c cocoa	1/2 c veg oil
1 tsp baking powder	2 tsp vanilla
1 tsp salt	1 c warm water
Mousse: 13 oz semi-sweet chopped choc.	2 T hazelnut liqueur
2 oz butter	2 1/2 c heavy cream
1/3 c egg yolks	1 c ground hazelnuts
1/3 c sugar	
Ganache: 2 c heavy cream	1 1/2 lbs semi-sweet
2 oz butter	chopped chocolate

Directions: For cake, combine dry ingredients; mix wet ingredients, add to dry and mix well. Pour batter into two greased 10" cake pans and bake at 350° for 30-40 min. Remove from oven, let cool.

For mousse, melt chocolate and butter in double boiler, stirring until smooth; remove from heat. Whip in egg yolks, then liqueur, and whip until smooth. Beat heavy cream to stiff peaks; add sugar, mixing until combined. Fold whipped cream mixture, one cup at a time, into chocolate mix. Gently fold in hazelnuts and let mousse set 90 mins.

For ganache, bring cream and butter to a boil. Remove and pour over chocolate. Mix well, until combined and let cool slightly.

To assemble cake, place mousse on top of cooled cake. Spread evenly and allow to set for 1-2 hrs. Pour ganache over cake and smooth edges with cake spatula. Garnish with chopped hazelnuts. Happy Valentine's Day!
